

# EXHIBIT 1

The following could be implemented by the Chief of Police without having to amend the City Code, however, if necessary, **the recommended amendment is to add item (e) to § 116.02 :**

*Accreditation: (CHAPTER 116: DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY Powers and Duties of Bureau Chiefs and Director of Public safety)*

**§ 116.02 (I)(d): The oversight of the Police Force accreditation process, the supervision of the accreditation manager and related staff or committee, and the assurance of attainment of police accreditation and continued reaccreditations.**

## **§ 116.02 POWERS AND DUTIES OF BUREAU CHIEFS**

(e) It shall be the duty of the Chief of Police to publish an annual report to the public that includes the following information:

- i. Number of sworn police personnel authorized by City Council
- ii. Number of officers on the force
- iii. Number of officers on active duty
- iv. Number of officers assigned to each duty and duty location
- v. Number of officers on workers' compensation Number of officers on disability leave
- vi. Number of officers on military or other specified extended leave
- vii. Number of officer separations in the reporting period, distinguished by the nature of the separation and voluntary status.
- viii. Number of officer retirements effected in the reporting period
- ix. Number of officers disciplined, distinguished by offense and level of discipline, including termination
- x. Number and nature of complaints against officers received, segregated by OMI and PBP receipt, disposition, and notation of any policy or procedural changes resulting from an annual review of complaint patterns.
- xi. Number of grievances and arbitrations taken from a disciplinary action and the results thereof.
- xii. Number of officers losing state certification and reason for revocation
- xiii. Number of officers whose state certification has been suspended and reason for suspension

- xiv. Number of officers sued, the nature of those suits and outcomes discerned by personal and public responsibility.
- xv. Number of officers arrested or criminally charged.
- xvi. Race, gender and age profile of active duty officers
- xvii. Educational attainment of officers distinguished by academic credential.
- xviii. Number of calls for service answered by the police
- xix. Average response time to calls by police by Zone
- xx. Number of arrests by charge, race, and gender distinguished by Zone and specialized units
- xxi. Number of convictions by charge, race, and gender distinguished by Zone and specialized units
- xxii. Number of traffic stops by race and gender and gender distinguished by Zone and specialized units
- xxiii. Recruitment and retention plan implemented by the Bureau of Police.
- xxiv. Results of applicants' written test distinguished by race, gender, age.
- xxv. Eligibility list distinguished by race, gender, age, veteran status and preference.
- xxvi. Replication of the motor vehicle pursuit statistics as submitted to the Pennsylvania State Police. For the reporting period.
- xxvii. Replication of the annual uniform crime report as submitted to the Pennsylvania State Police.

## **TITLE ONE**

### **ARTICLE VII: PROCEDURES**

#### **CHAPTER 160: INVESTIGATIONS OF POLICE CONDUCT**

Immediately after a City police officer discharges a firearm causing bodily injury, serious bodily injury or the death of another person or persons, the Director of the Department of Public Safety shall immediately make a request to another law enforcement agency, such as the Allegheny County Police, or the Pennsylvania State Police, to supervise the investigation. The City shall thereafter exercise its investigatory and law enforcement powers as directed by the other law enforcement agency, unless the other agency either refuses the request or does not promptly, under the circumstances, give any response to the request.

##### **§ 160.01 REQUEST TO OTHER LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY.**

Immediately after a City police officer discharges a firearm causing bodily injury, serious bodily injury or the death of another person or persons, the Director of the Department of Public Safety shall immediately make a request to another law enforcement agency, such as the Allegheny County Police, or the Pennsylvania State Police, to supervise the investigation. The City shall thereafter exercise its investigatory and law enforcement powers as directed by the other law enforcement agency, unless the other agency either refuses the request or does not promptly, under the circumstances, give any response to the request.

##### **ADD THE FOLLOWING SECTION TO ORD. 31-1996, EFF.11-1-96)**

###### **§ 160.02**

a) The administration of the City of Pittsburgh and all sworn members of the Pittsburgh Bureau of Police, will comply with the provisions of the Pittsburgh City Code, *Title Six Conduct, Article VI Citizen Police Review Board, Chapter 661, Chapter 662.*

b) The provisions of *Title Six Conduct, Article VI Citizen Police Review Board, Chapter 661, Chapter 662, as promulgated, shall not be subjected to collective bargaining.*
