Dear Governor Shapiro:

First, let us wish you and your family a happy and productive New Year on behalf of the Black Political Empowerment Project.

Soon, you will be appointing Judges to the Superior Court and the Court of Common Pleas Fifth District in Allegheny County. The Black Political Empowerment Project (B-PEP) asks that you appoint African-American judges to fill both vacancies in these courts.

Since 1986, B-PEP has been advocating for, and increasing voter participation in, Allegheny County and throughout our Commonwealth. It is the mission of B-PEP that "African Americans VOTE in EACH and EVERY election!", but also that those in elected and appointed positions expeditiously and effectively meet the needs, aspirations, and concerns of the African-American residents that they serve. This includes the judiciary, which is considered the last resort in resolving disputes.

The 2020 U.S. Census says that 13.5% of Allegheny County residents are African Americans, while the population of African Americans in the Allegheny County jail stands above 66% as of the date of this letter.

With only one African-American judge on the Superior Court, its composition is 5.6-6.7% African American (depending on whether one includes senior judges). We believe the appointment of a qualified African-American judge to fill the vacancy created by the election of Judge McCaffrey to the PA Supreme Court will not cure the disparities and discrimination that African Americans have endured but will at least be a step in the right direction.

With only six African Americans out of 43 judges on the Court of Common Pleas of Allegheny County, and only one serving in the Criminal Division where over 60% of its defendants are persons of color, it is hard to fathom a sense of justice in the minds of the majority of defendants who come before this court. There are far too many African Americans and people of color coming before the bench and too few African Americans sitting *on* the bench.
